About the Call

The MedCUC – MedCities’ Climate Urban Capacity Programme, funded by the City Climate Finance Gap Fund launched on 20 June 2025 a Call for Applications aimed at supporting non-EU Mediterranean local authorities in the preparation of climate-resilient and low-carbon urban projects. The Call closed on 27 July 2025. A total of twenty-one applications were received from local authorities across the eligible countries.

Selected Beneficiaries

Following this process, the Selection Committee has approved the selection of nine local authorities to participate in the MedCUC Programme:

- Al Fayhaa Urban Community (Lebanon)
- Almuwaqqar Municipality (Jordan)
- Greater Madaba Municipality (Jordan)
- Hatay Metropolitan Municipality (Türkiye)
- Mahdia Municipality (Tunisia)
- Sarajevo Municipality (Bosnia and Herzegovina)
- Tetouan Municipality (Morocco)
- Tirana Municipality (Albania)
- Zgarta -Ehden Municipality (Lebanon)

About the selection process

All the eligible applications were technically assessed by the MedCUC team, based on the following criteria:

- Relevance of the project (30 points)
- Maturity of the project (20 points)
- City’s engagement towards climate action (50 points)

A Selection Committee, composed of the three Focal Points of the MedCUC Programme and one representative of MedCities, then met on the 10th of September 2025 to review the evaluations and determine the final list of Beneficiaries.

In addition to the technical assessment, the Selection Committee applied geographical balance and institutional considerations to ensure a fair distribution of beneficiaries across the Mediterranean region and to strengthen the potential impact of the Programme.
